



## Stupid Cancer Research Partnerships

**Objective: Stupid Cancer partners with researchers and institutions who support patient-centered research that aligns with improving outcomes for AYAs affected by cancer and is responsive to the experiences and needs of the AYA community.**

If you are interested in recruiting study participants through Stupid Cancer's network, please read this document thoroughly before emailing [programs@stupidcancer.org](mailto:programs@stupidcancer.org) with your research partnership inquiry. Your inquiry should contain the following information:

1. Study aims, methods, and timeline (i.e. recruitment deadline; dates of data analysis; etc.)
2. IRB approval
3. Participant requirements and incentives
4. Explanation of the study's impact on the AYA cancer community
5. Study recruitment graphic to share on social media (graphic dimensions should be 1080 x 1080)

After reviewing the above information, Stupid Cancer will either approve or deny your request to recruit from our community. If your request is approved, Stupid Cancer will:

- Share two recruitment posts on social media. Typically, posts will occur one month apart. We will align with your recruitment timeline as closely as we're able, given calendar availability.
- Share a direct link to your study on the [Research Studies](#) page of our website for a maximum of 6 months.

Research Partner will:

- Provide Stupid Cancer a summation of main research findings at the conclusion of the study that we can share within our community. This would be in the form of a one-page, formatted PDF that summarizes your aims, your results, and how your research impacts the psychosocial/medical experience of the AYA community. We may follow up to explore the potential further collaborations, including but not limited to: social media campaigns, recorded webinars, and/or dedicated panels/presentations at our annual cancer conference, CancerCon.
  - Summary of findings to be submitted to Stupid Cancer within three months of data analysis.
  - Any publication(s) in peer-reviewed journals may also be shared with Stupid Cancer, but are not required.
- Share a story through [Stupid Cancer Stories](#) about your experiences with the AYA community, including what drives you to focus on AYA research, what inspired this specific study, why it is important to share research outcomes with the community, and how AYAs can access this study's outcomes in the future.
